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
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Dear Intermediate Teacher,




Please note: In an effort to provide more flexible material and encourage teachers to model Bible reading for their students, we have chosen to leave the Scripture block out of these lessons.



The Lord Jesus Christ has always existed. He, the Father, and the Spirit are one. Jesus confirmed that fact through His power over sickness and death. One time when He declared He is God to His Jewish followers, they wanted to kill Him. He would not be killed until the chosen time, however. Before that time, He established that He is God by healing the sick and raising the dead. His own death for our sins, His burial, and especially His rising from the dead confirmed He is God. Only God the Son could die for us and then conquer sin and death by coming to life again.








Jesus' Claim to Deity

Lesson Text: John 8:31-38, 48-56, 58-59





Big Idea: Jesus is God, and His truth can set us free from sin.

Prepare Your Mind

Jews took (and still take) the holiness of God very seriously. Committing blasphemy is considered an extremely serious offense. As Jesus' speech progresses in today's passage, you can almost feel the crowd's blood pressure rising. Jesus claimed to set people free from sin and death. He claimed that God is His Father and that He is greater than Abraham. Finally, Jesus linked His own identity with the revealed divine name of God (John 8:58; see Ex. 3:14). In so doing, in the eyes of Jesus' hard-hearted audience, He committed the ultimate act of blasphemy. Instead of responding with faith in what God was revealing through the Person and work of His Son, Jesus, the Jewish religious leaders and their followers rejected Jesus and His teaching. In the ancient world and today, acknowledging Jesus as Lord distinguishes people who belong to God from people who do not.

Prepare Your Heart

Our hearts' disposition is not always so far removed from the crowd in today's passage. Even when we have trusted Jesus and received His gift of eternal life and forgiveness, we can be prone to injecting our own ideas and pride into other areas of our lives. We can have confidence in our own abilities and wisdom instead of recognizing and relying on God. Needing only Jesus makes sense to us in regard to receiving His gift of salvation, but what about in regard to giving Him the rightful position of being first in our lives? Since Jesus is Lord, His sufficiency to save us extends to being able to guide and sustain us in all aspects of life. Acknowledging Jesus as Lord is something we should do with our mouths and with our lives, being submitted to glorifying Him.
