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
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Dear Junior Teacher,


Here are a few old favorites reimagined:

- Explaining the Memory Verse explains the Scripture in language familiar to juniors (replacing Talking about the Golden Text).



Here are some new features:

- **Introductory pages** for each unit will point toward the quarter's major themes.
- Supplies and Prepare the Room give teachers all the practical information they need to prepare for class time.
- The Conversation Starter helps you kick off your class and get your students invested in the lesson.
- Discussion Questions help students engage with the Scriptures intellectually and emotionally throughout the lesson. These questions appear in both the class and teacher books.

Your students hear many voices from the culture that tell them to live counter to the way God would have them live. As we see from the lessons in this unit, standing for God is not always easy. In many ways, it is good to know the battle is not new. God has strengthened His people in times of persecution and fierce cultural hostility to faith in the one True God. Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah show us that standing for God can be done even in the hardest times. This encourages us to remain faithful to the Lord.







Daniel Honors God's Law

Lesson Text: Daniel 1:8-21



But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's meat (Daniel 1:8).





Big Idea: Daniel and his three friends honor God with their choice.

DANIEL 1:8 But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's meat, nor with the wine which he drank: therefore he requested of the prince of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.

- 9 Now God had brought Daniel into favour and tender love with the prince of the eunuchs.
- 10 And the prince of the eunuchs said unto Daniel, I fear my lord the king, who hath appointed your meat and your drink: for why should he see your faces worse liking than the children which are of your sort? then shall ye make me endanger my head to the king.
- 11 Then said Daniel to Melzar, whom the prince of the eunuchs had set over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah,
- 12 Prove thy servants, I beseech thee, ten days; and let them give us pulse to eat, and water to drink.
- 13 Then let our countenances be looked upon before thee, and the countenance of the children that eat of the portion of the king's meat: and as thou seest, deal with thy servants.
- 14 So he consented to them in this matter, and proved them ten days.

- 15 And at the end of ten days their countenances appeared fairer and fatter in flesh than all the children which did eat the portion of the king's meat.
- 16 Thus Melzar took away the portion of their meat, and the wine that they should drink; and gave them pulse.
- 17 As for these four children, God gave them knowledge and skill in all learning and wisdom: and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams.
- 18 Now at the end of the days that the king had said he should bring them in, then the prince of the eunuchs brought them in before Nebuchadnezzar.
- 19 And the king communed with them; and among them all was found none like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah: therefore stood they before the king.
- 20 And in all matters of wisdom and understanding, that the king enquired of them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and astrologers that were in all his realm.
- 21 And Daniel continued even unto the first year of king Cyrus.

Prepare Your Mind

It was a sad time for Judah. Many people had chosen to follow King Jehoiakim's bad example by worshipping false gods. God repeatedly warned them about their disobedience, but many didn't listen. So God allowed Jehoiakim and the kingdom of Judah to be defeated by the Babylonians and taken into exile.

King Nebuchadnezzar commanded that the brightest and most handsome captives be educated and taught to serve in the Babylonian courts. The king planned a course of study for those young men. Daniel had the opportunity to acquire the best possible education of the day. We are not told specifically the reason for refusing the king's food, but we do know that Daniel believed he would be defiled and dishonor God if he ate the food that the king provided.

Prepare Your Heart

We may not be fans of exercise, but we want to stay fit and strong even when we are old. Starting can be difficult, but the more the muscles get worked, the easier it is.

It's the same with strengthening the "honoring God" muscles. The more we choose Him over other things and study His Word, the stronger we grow. Jesus said to seek God's kingdom first and His righteousness, and everything else would follow. Pray that your students begin following God now, just as Daniel and his three friends did.

Conversation Starter
